BACK TO THE FUTURE... R. COHEN'S REMARKS FROM CBI'S JUNE GALA

Robert Zemeckis and Steven Spielberg didn't invent the time machine...our rabbis accomplished that long ago.

Some of us might be familiar with the following *midrash* (BT Menachot 29b):

"Rav Judah said in the name of Rav: At the time that Moses ascended to Heaven he found the Holy and Blessed One sitting and affixing crowns to the letters. [Moses] said to him: "Master of the Universe, who is forcing Your hand [in that you must add crowns to what you have written]?" God said to him: "There is a certain man who will live after many generations, by the name of Akiva ben Joseph, who will one day extract piles and piles of *halakhot* (laws) from each and every jot." He said to God: "Master of the Universe, show him to me." God said: "Turn around." [In other words, use a time machine to go to the future and see this man]. Moses then went and sat at the back of eight rows [in Akiva's academy], and he could not grasp what they were saying. At this, [Moses] began to feel powerless. But when they reached one particular matter, the disciples said to Akiva: "Master, where do you know this from?" He said to them, "it is a halakhah [a law and teaching] given to Moses from Sinai." At that, Moses felt better."

Now imagine if some of our community's original founders, among them men and women of whom many are no longer with us, walked into CBI right now. Imagine if those who were here in the 50s and 60s joined us for Shabbat...

I can't help but think of Izzy Sher z"l. Izzy was one of CBI's most eccentric and colorful personalities. Izzy would say *kad*-*dish* at every service he attended at CBI, in remembrance of the 6 million who perished in the Shoah. Imagine if Izzy walked into CBI nowadays... I would like to believe that Izzy would be comforted to learn that Sam Ginsburg has taken up

saying *kaddish* on his behalf, every time he prays with our community.

I also think of Katy Tornheim z"l. Katy was the first woman president of an orthodox shul in the world. I bet Katy would be pleased to meet Maharat Victoria Sutton, the first woman to serve in a full time capacity as clergy in a West Coast shul.

Archie and Shoshana Greenberg z"l also come to mind. Archie and Shoshana were among the founders of our shul and served at its leadership for many decades. Before leaving this world, Archie assigned varying shul related responsibilities to different members of the community. I believe that Archie would be greatly comforted to learn that the Ner Tamid is tended to by Seth Greenberg and that the Yahrzeit lights are tended to by Carol Cunradi and Jory Gessow. I also believe that Shoshana Greenberg would take great pride in our new Gan Shalom building – a center she envisioned and tirelessly worked for together with Joan Sopher and Justin Sweet (may they both be blessed and continue to merit good and healthy long lives). Shoshana, Joan and Justin accomplished thirty years ago what Michael Feiner and Stan Wulf (leaders of the Gan rebuild project) just accomplished for us now. It is comforting and inspiring to see the leadership torch being handed down from one generation to another.

I also think of my teachers, R. Saul Berman and R. Leibowitz (*shlit*"a – may they both be well and merit good, healthy, and long lives). I pray that if (and when) they walk into CBI, they would recognize the Torah that is shared within the walls of our sanctuary, for the Torah that we have now is still their Torah. Indeed, it is the same Torah of R. Akiva and the Torah of Moses from Sinai.

A number of years ago our community set out to rebuild our Gan Shalom Preschool and Shabbat Youth Center. As we approached the time of construction, our preschool director Laura Lipman and I began searching for an alternative space to serve our preschool community during the time of construction. Through meticulous research, our preschool director discovered that a local Asian church owned a minister's home on its lot that was vacant. After consultation and research, Laura and I went to meet the church's board president.

During an hour's meeting, Laura and I walked through the space and, channeling Gan Shalom's creativity, we began to lay out a vision for transforming the vacant minister's home into a preschool. The church's president stood on the side mesmerized. "This will be the nap room..." "That will become the art center..." "This will be perfect for circle time."

At the end of the meeting, the president thanked us and promised to return with an answer from the church's board. A few days passed and we heard back that the board turned down our offer.

With our backs against the wall (we contacted countless other places as well), we began dreaming of transforming our

shul space...Our shul library became the area for circle time (and all books were removed), my office became the area for art work and nap time (thank God for coffee shops and long walks), our shul patio became a bicycle runway.

Our communal space grew smaller...but our hearts grew wider.

A year after hearing back from the church, I drove by it only to notice a sign on its outer gate. The sign announced the opening of a new Church preschool. It seems like the vision we had shared during our visit took root. The minister's vacant home did become a preschool after all...And as I saw that sign, I couldn't help but smile.

Now - thank God! - It is our time to hang up a sign.

Our prophets spoke of a time when the Home of God will become a worship place for all people. It is wholly holy to begin with our children.

It was a blessing to officially dedicate our new Gan Shalom Youth Center on Aug. 30. Help us to raise the remaining 60K by making a pledge today!

Stan: From zoning meetings, mediation, budgeting, you have given your heart and soul to this project and we could not have made it through to the end without your leadership and humor. Thank you. Rabbi Cohen: You are an inspiring leader and teacher — with a flair for interior decorating. I can't thank you enough for constantly paying attention to the thousands of details that went into the building of this building. Your vision, your energy and enthusiasm at every moment, kept me going. This could not have been without you. Thank you.

LOST AND FOUND – WRITING TO REMEMBER

A few weeks ago, a small group of women had the fortune of spending an afternoon with writing instructor, author, and neighbor Monica Wesolowska, as part of a CBI-sponsored workshop titled "Lost and Found – Writing to Remember". This workshop was part of the ongoing series that Rabbi Cohen and Maharat Victoria spearheaded, I believe in part to address the reflexive discomfort that people often have when thinking and talking about death and mourning. In trying to openly discuss these topics, we can at once feel supported in our own mourning processes, as well as be more effective in offering support to others who need us.

Monica used short, guided exercises to help us coax sometimes painful, often bittersweet memories from the vaults within our minds, and made what may initially have seemed like a daunting task a deeply rewarding one.

We had the opportunity to bond with one another through both laughter and tears. The atmosphere was intimate, respectful, and inspiring, knowing that even though we each had our own reasons for being there, around that table, there was more in common than different. Together, we discovered the power of putting our personal memories on paper, and then (if we wished) of reading them. During the process, we understood that this give and take, listening and sharing, can be very centering and cleansing.

One of the things that I personally most enjoyed at this workshop was that it demonstrated that both younger and older members of our community can unite around a common purpose, and that loss has many flavors. My wish going forward is that the CBI community can continue to be supportive of one another around loss, whether death or otherwise, and strive to cultivate a greater sensitivity as to how best offer support during a fellow community member's most vulnerable period. I have always been deeply appreciative of CBI and in experiencing the recent loss of my mother. I am so thankful that our community's leadership is keen on taking a multi-faceted approach to offer support to mourners, not least of which has been the opportunity to participate in this outstanding workshop.

LAUNCHING THE CBI BERKELEY GEMACH

We are excited to announce the launch of the CBI Berkeley Gemach (http://www.cbiberkeley.org/connect/gemach/). Gemach is short for *gemilut chasadim* — "acts of kindness." It's a traditonal Jewish organization that pools community resources and loans them out. By sharing what we have, we can reduce waste (*bal tashchit*), assist those in need (*tzedakah*), and foster warmth and intimacy (*kehillat chesed*).

There are several different kinds of gemach. At present, ours has two sections:

A Simcha Gemach: Throwing a kosher event, such as a wedding or bar/bat mitzvah, can be expensive. To help offset the cost, we offer plates, cutlery, tables, chairs, decorations, and more. In future, we hope also to offer a selection of bridal gowns and boys' bar mitzvah suits. *Please note: all our food items are strictly kosher and may only be used for events with approved kashrut supervision.*

A Children's Gemach. Babies are expensive, too! We stock big ticket items such as strollers, changing tables, and cribs, as well as clothes, diapers, pacifiers, etc.

At this time, the gemach serves any member of the CBI community. Borrowing and donating is by appointment only.

To borrow: Start by browsing the galleries on our website.

Write down the name of the item(s) you'd like to borrow, then send us an email (gemach@cbiberkeley.org). Someone will get back to you soon. If the item is available, we'll arrange a time and place for you to come pick it up. A deposit may be required for certain items. This will be refunded upon return of the items in good condition.

To donate: Please only offer items in good condition. If you wouldn't use it yourself or loan it to a good friend, then it's not right for us. Remember: we're not a dump.

Start by sending us an email (gemach@cbiberkeley.org). Briefly describe the item(s) you'd like to donate. Attach a picture, if you can. If we need it and have room for it, we'll get back to you and arrange to include it in our gemach. You can also offer to add an item to the catalog and store at your own house. (Much appreciated, as our space is limited.)

Please do not bring items to the shul. There is no place to put them.

To volunteer: We need volunteers to collect items, maintain our online galleries and catalog, and provide storage space. E mail us if you would like to help.



NEW MEMBER PROFILE • YONI AND LAYA COOPERMAN

Yoni and Laya Cooperman might finally be official residents of Berkeley, but they have been regulars at CBI since their first visit two years ago. The first time the couple came to Berkeley was for *Simchat Torah* 2013. They were living in Sacramento at the time, and came to visit friends Gabe Greenberg and Abby Streusand, and Dean and Lauren Robinson. Laya recalls," It was just the most amazing *Simchat Torah* I ever had - a community with all ages and all backgrounds - the whole spectrum. So we went home that weekend, and basically said - we have to live there." "But it took us awhile to get there," she adds.

For the next year and a half, Yoni and Laya started coming to CBI at least once a month. Initially, the Cooperman's had a small rotation of hosts which quickly expanded to at least ten different homes. They recall, "Every time we came, someone asked 'Where are you staying next time?'" The hospitality was a huge motivator to move here. So were the demographics. "There are Jewish people our age in Berkeley, which was a huge deal, especially coming from Sacramento, where that was an issue."

Yoni and Laya were both studying at UC Davis at the time. Yoni is a graduate student in Soil and Biogeochemistry at Davis, with a focus on greenhouse gas emissions and emissions from agricultural soils. Yoni is interested in soil science as "it involves all of the sciences". Laya was completing a Master's in Public Health at UC Davis. She currently works at UCSF doing injury prevention research in a program called the Wraparound Project. The goal of the program is to prevent individuals who have had a violence-related injury from having another such injury. Laya does statistical research in evaluating the effectiveness of the program and potential ways to expand or improve on it.

Originally from Baltimore, Maryland, Yoni went to Beth Tfiloh from kindergarten through high school. After high school, he studied at Eretz HaTzvi for two years in Jerusalem and then University of Maryland, where the couple met. Laya grew up in Silver Spring, Maryland, which is very different than Baltimore and attended the Hebrew Academy through high school. She then spent one year learning at Nishmat in Israel.

They had met a few times on campus at various events, but



they really started to get to know each other at a friend's birthday party involving a huge discussion about the differing views on *Olam Haba* between Rambam (Laya) and Rebbi Nachman (Yoni). "We were both very passionate about our views." It took a few more months, but eventually they got to the conclusion that they should be together. They were married in March 2013 at a Nature Conservancy in Maryland. It was the last day of Adar, a compromise between their birthday months (Adar and Nisan). "We didn't care that it was a Monday night!" They both like hiking and dancing. Laya enjoys baking and Yoni enjoys eating the dessert. Yoni is a Baltimore Orioles baseball fan.

They moved to Berkeley in January 2015, after some aggressive Craigslist scouring and a string of open houses (as well as a number of weeks staying with the Robinsons before their apartment was ready). It seems it was worth the wait, they love their new apartment. And when asked whether living in Berkeley was everything they thought it would be? "Oh yeah!"

Yitzhak Rabin (March 1, 1922 – November 4, 1995) was the fifth Prime Minister of Israel and the first to be assassinated. In 1994 he won the Nobel Peace Prize along with Shimon Peres and Yasir Arafat. He also signed a peace treaty with Jordan in 1994. He was assassinated by Yigal Amir, a Jewish Israeli, following an appearance at a peace rally attended by more than 100,000 in Tel Aviv. He had surprised everyone by remaining on stage after his speech and singing "Shir Lashalom" ("A Song for Peace") with the crowd. 
