SCHOLAR-IN-RESIDENCE R. AARON LEIBOWITZ, JULY 1-2

Rabbi Aaron Leibowitz grew up in CBI and is the son of Rabbi Yosef Leibowitz, rabbi of CBI 1969-1985.. He is the founder and President of Hashgacha Pratit, an organization which broke the monopoly of the Chief Rabbinate of Israel over Kosher Supervision. Their new project, Chuppot, challenges the monopoly by providing Orthodox weddings independent of the Rabbanut. Ordained by Rabbi Shlomo Riskin and Rabbi Chaim Brovender in 1996 he currently serves as the Rabbi of the Va'ani Teffilah community in Nachlaot, Jerusalem. Rav Aaron served as a Jerusalem City Council member in the previous term, representing the pluralistic Yerushalmim party, and holding the education portfolio.
