Historian Richard Schwartz: *The Man Who Lit Lady Liberty*

Richard's new book, *The Man Who Lit Lady Liberty: The Extraordinary Rise and Fall of Actor M.B. Curtis*, tells the amazing life story of immigrant actor M.B. Curtis. Curtis catapulted to overnight stardom in 1880 and was the first American Jewish actor to portray a Jewish character on stage, using his comedic talent to overcome common stereotypes and prejudices of the time. In gratitude for his life in America, Curtis also personally paid for the lighting of the Statue of Liberty at a time when Congress would not fund it. A story of stardom and great personal struggles, this book shines a torch on one actor's creativity and cultural influence that greatly impacted the East Bay area.
