Etrogei Shemittah

This year is a shemittah year in Israel, and the fruits grown in Israel are imbued with special kedushah (sanctity). Although ordinarily there is a prohibition of exporting peirot shevi'it (fruits of the 7th year) from Israel, this does not apply to etrogim which are being sent for the purpose of a mitzvah. Rav Soloveitchik, zt"l, encouraged everyone to purchase these etrogim. It is especially important to support Israeli farmers in this difficult year. According to some estimates, this year Israeli farmers may stand to lose 50% of their market. Of course, the etrogim like every other year should have proper hashgacha (supervision).

****There are several halachot (laws) that one should be aware of regarding etrogim grown in Israel during shemittah because they have kedushah (sanctity).**

- The etrog may not be discarded after Sukkot, but rather it should be placed in a safe place to dry up on its own. Once the etrog completely dries up, it may be discarded.
- If one plans on making etrog jelly, the jelly has kedushah and no part **[including the seeds]** should be wasted. It should be consumed before Chodesh Shevat, or else the laws of bi'ur would apply.
- CBI will gladly collect etrogim for proper handling after the holiday.

You are welcome to drop off your Israeli etrogim (or others) at the shul after Simhat Torah.
