



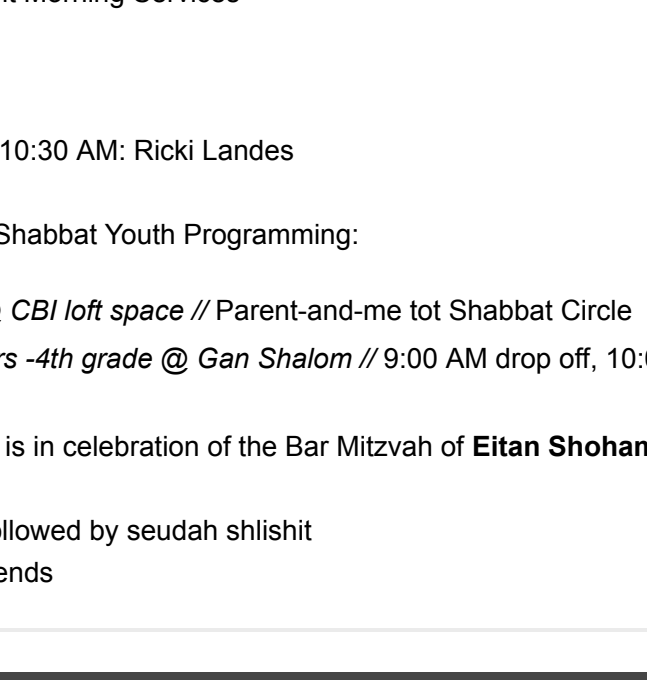

Mizrahi-Ashkenazi Relations in Israel

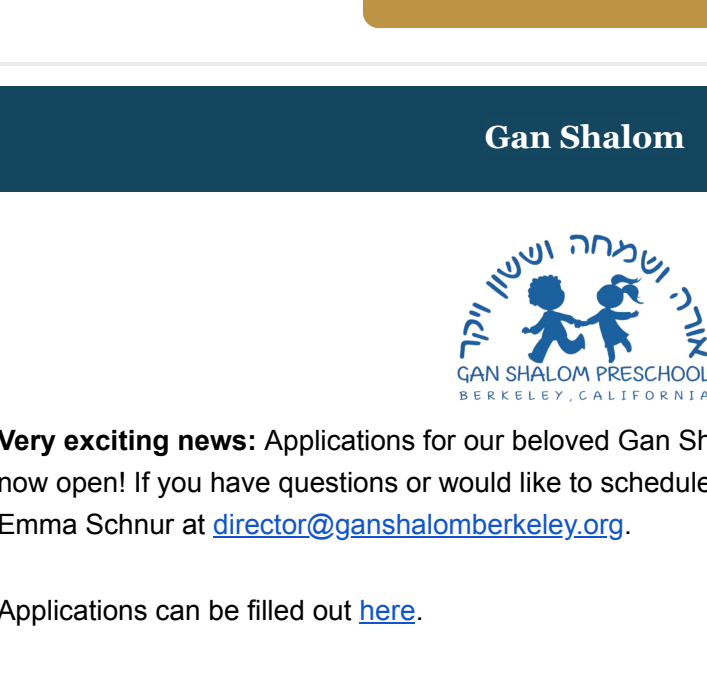


Dr. Yifat Moas is a cultural researcher and a sociologist of social movements and political mobilization. She teaches courses on Israeli society at UC Berkeley.

May 3, 10, and 17 at 7:30 pm

Many people outside Israel are unfamiliar with the major role that relations between Mizrahim and Ashkenazim have played in shaping Israeli society. Across three sessions, we will explore this relationship as one marked on the one hand, by cooperation, solidarity, and a sense of shared fate, and on the other by ethnic tension and conflict. We will examine the roots of this conflict and its different expressions over time, the development of the Mizrahi movement, consider the continued relevance of ethnic discourse to some of the major divisions in Israeli society today, and reflect on the future of these relations.

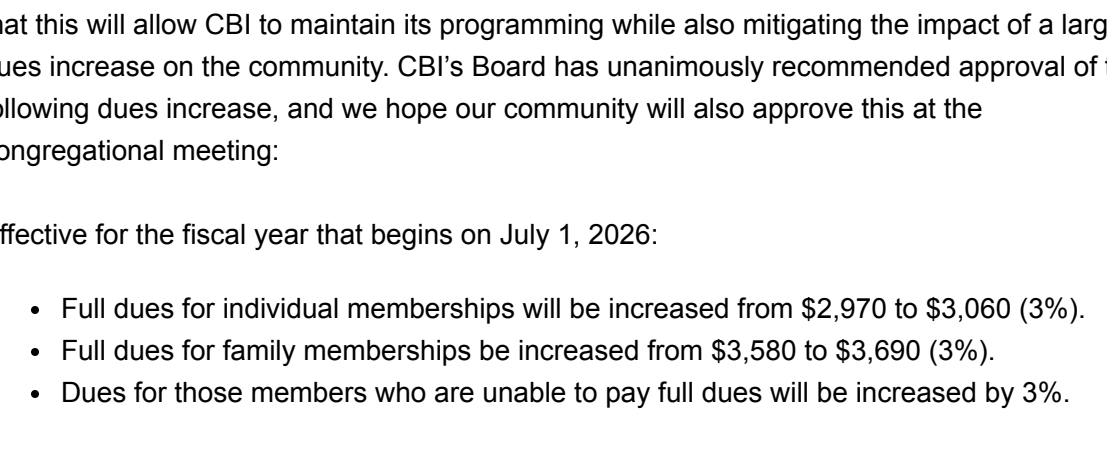

Eligibility: Did you know that 37% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, but fewer than 10% of eligible donors do so each year? Please be part of the solution!

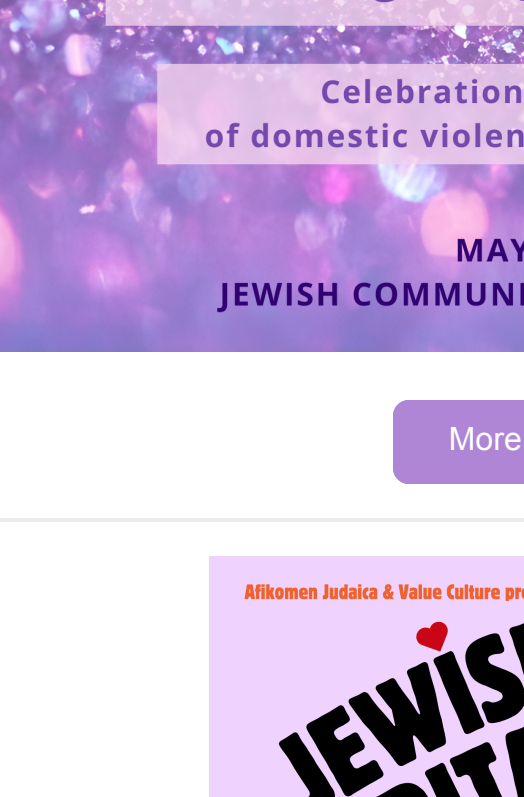

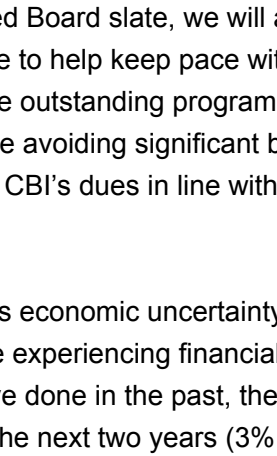

Notice of Congregational Meeting

Dear CBI Family,

Please join us on Sunday, May 17th for our annual congregational meeting, where we will elect the 2024-2026 Board Officers and Directors (as required by CBI's by-laws). A catered breakfast will be served at 9am. Childcare (RSVP required) will be offered at Gan. The congregational meeting will begin in the Sanctuary at 10am and conclude by 11:30am ([RSVP for breakfast, childcare and meeting here](#)). In addition to voting on the proposed Board slate, we will also ask the congregation to approve our biannual dues increase to help keep pace with rising expenses. These additional funds are essential to sustaining the outstanding programs and professional staff that make CBI such a vibrant community, while avoiding significant budget deficits. The increase will help us meet rising costs and keep CBI's dues in line with those of other congregations in the area.

CBI's Board recognizes that there is economic uncertainty in these times and that many members of our community may be experiencing financial strain. Therefore, rather than a one-time increase of 6% as we have done in the past, the Board is proposing a staggered increase of 6% over the course of the next two years (3% each year). It is the Board's hope that this will allow CBI to maintain its programming while also mitigating the impact of a larger dues increase on the community. CBI's Board has unanimously recommended approval of the following dues increase, and we hope our community will also approve this at the congregational meeting:

Effective for the fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2026:

- Full dues for individual memberships will be increased from \$2,970 to \$3,060 (3%).
- Full dues for family memberships be increased from \$3,580 to \$3,690 (3%).
- Dues for those members who are unable to pay full dues will be increased by 3%.

Effective for the fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2027:

- Full dues for individual memberships will be increased from \$3,060 to \$3,150 (3%).
- Full dues for family memberships be increased from \$3,690 to \$3,810 (3%).
- Dues for those members who are unable to pay full dues will be increased by 3%.

As is always our policy, no one will be turned away due to financial hardship. If you are in the position to contribute more than the full dues amount and would like more information about ways to support our community, please reach out to Ori Kanefsky, Jessica Fain, or Rabbi Cohen.

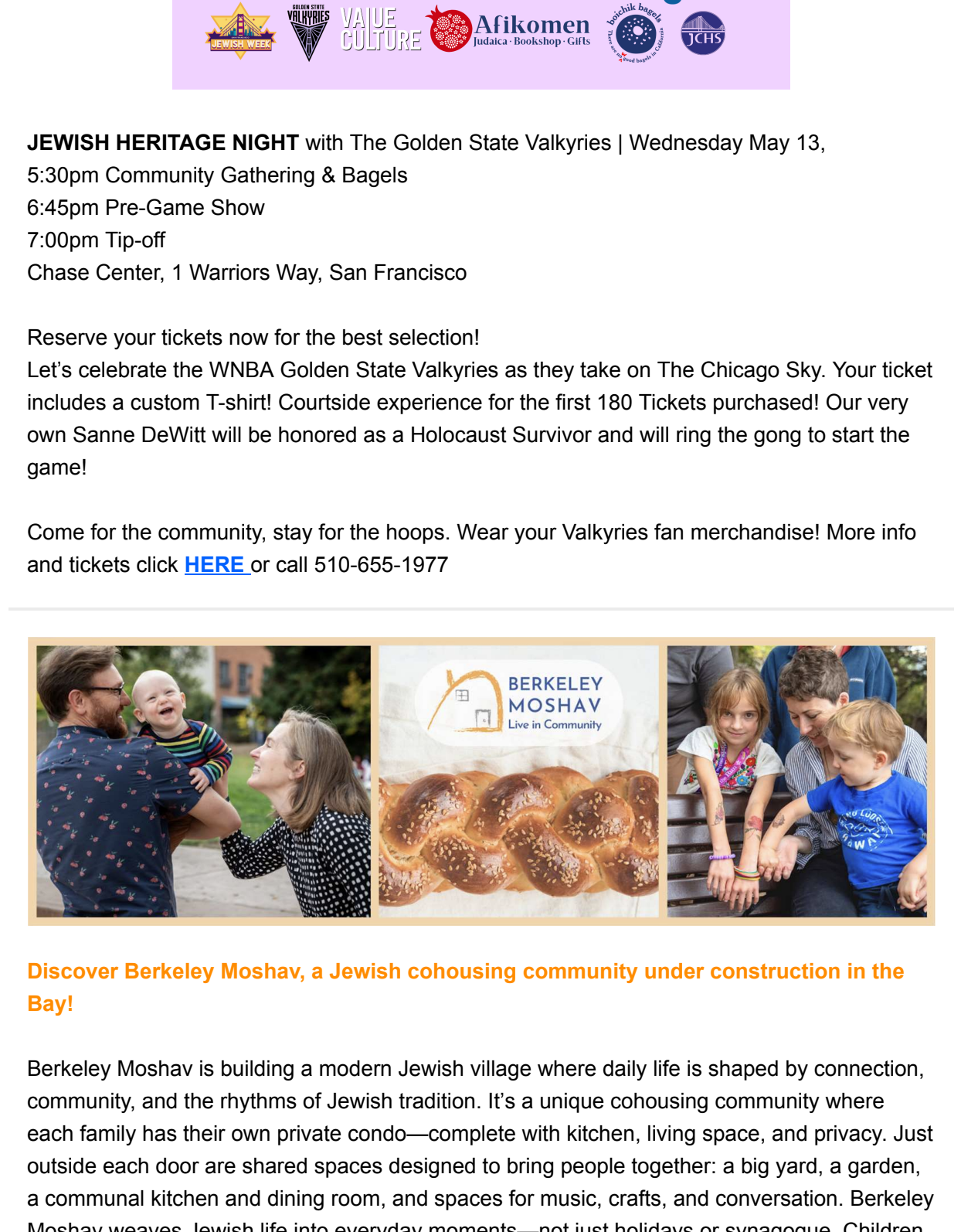

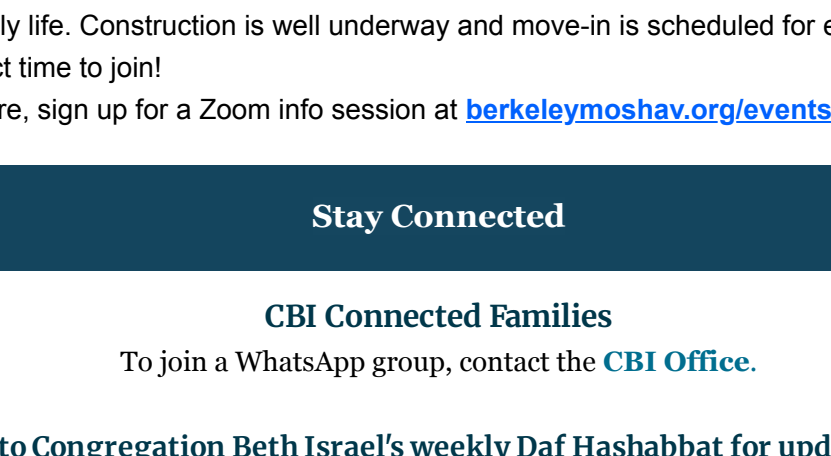
